We do this by providing food, training, and resources to food assistance programs in Berkshire, Franklin, Hampden, and Hampshire counties; empowering communities to find sustainable solutions to hunger; and spreading public awareness about the problem of hunger.

Thank you for making our work possible.

Coming off the worst economic crisis the United States has seen in decades, The Food Bank faced unprecedented need in our communities as we began our 2010 fiscal year in October 2009.

We knew it wouldn't be an easy year for our communities, and it wasn't. At least 15,000 people sought food assistance each week, and high unemployment continued to take its toll on families and working adults seeking to make ends meet. A regional study conducted by The Food Bank and Feeding America found that the number of people seeking food assistance in 2010 had increased by 22 percent since 2006.

Late in the year, the economy began to show signs of improvement, at least for some. Unfortunately, the strengthening of the economy has been slow to reach those who need it most. While economists claimed that the "official" end of the recession was in June 2009, the Massachusetts unemployment rate was still at nine percent one year later (down from 9.5 percent in January 2010). In Western Massachusetts, unemployment still hovered at 8.9 percent by December 2010, nearly a full point higher than the statewide average. That's about twice the rate of unemployment we had in our communities prior to the start of the recession in Fall, 2007.

Fortunately, with your support, The Food Bank of Western Massachusetts was able to provide tangible benefits to people in need through our emergency food network, to support vulnerable families coping with immediate hardship. We also used our capacity to engage the entire community — residents, businesses and legislators — to raise awareness, work together on local projects, and shape public policy at all levels on matters of hunger, food insecurity and food access.

We believe that both immediate and long-term approaches are essential to our mission.


2010 was a year of accomplishment for The Food Bank, as we increased and streamlined our food distribution efforts in response to need. We distributed more than 7.7 million pounds of food through our core warehouse operations, Brown Bag program for elders, and our delivery program, including two new centralized delivery "drop sites." We expanded our SNAP (Food Stamps) outreach and enrollment efforts across the region, helping households obtain benefits through this federal nutrition program. We held successful nutrition education workshops for residents, were instrumental in advocating for national, state, and local policies that advance healthy food access, and supported community-based food security projects through Target:Hunger and the Springfield Food Access Project. These projects would not have been possible without the support and commitment of donors like you, who believe in our mission to reduce hunger and increase food security.

The Food Bank also went through an exciting and important transition in 2010


as we reached the successful conclusion of our pilot project, Target:Hunger, in Mason Square, Springfield. Leveraging the lessons we learned over the course of five years of Target:Hunger's work, we launched a new program called Network Capacity Building, which takes the community-based strategies of Target:Hunger to a regional level, working closely with the entire emergency food network.

Despite the hardships our communities faced in 2010, and a difficult economy that will continue to challenge The Food Bank and the households that need our services, we consider ourselves lucky to have such a broad and dedicated group of supporters and partners.

We couldn't have met the challenges of 2010 without your financial contributions, volunteer hours, food donations, in-kind services, or voices. Thank you for making our work possible.

Target:Hunger Transitions

For the last 28 years, The Food Bank of Western Massachusetts has met our mission of reducing hunger and increasing food security through a variety of programs and services. Our core food distribution operations are the heart of our work, ensuring that households across our region receive the food they need to survive. In addition, we run several community and educational programs that go beyond basic food distribution in an effort to address the underlying causes of hunger.

In 2010, we began an exciting transition in our programs as our five-year Target:Hunger pilot project came to an end. Target:Hunger was a community-based organizing initiative that sought to test a variety of activities to increase food security in two communities in Western Massachusetts: Mason Square, Springfield, and North Berkshire County. (The program will continue in North Berkshire County through the end of our fiscal year 2011,

but our Mason Square project officially ended on September 30, 2010.)

Over the course of five years, we worked with dozens of community partners in Springfield to increase access to affordable and nutritious foods through initiatives like the Mason Square Farmers Market, an infant formula pantry, nutrition workshops, outreach for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, the revitalization of the Mason Square Health Task Force, and the creation of the Springfield Food Policy Council.

Target:Hunger was a resounding success, thanks in large part to dedicated funders who believed in the power of a community-based model to create long-term solutions to hunger and food insecurity. In a true example of collective effort, community agencies, residents, and other partners stepped up to contribute time, energy and talent.

These partners are now leading the community toward next steps as The Food Bank scales back its role.

As we celebrated the successes of Target:Hunger, we also took a close look at how The Food Bank could leverage the lessons learned from the pilot project for greatest impact across our region. With the start of our fiscal year 2011, we launched a new Network Capacity Building program that takes many of Target:Hunger's strategies and applies them to the entire four-county region. Starting in Hampden County, Network Capacity Building is working closely with Food Bank member agencies to build partnerships, strengthen capacity, and enhance services so that vulnerable households may gain greater food self-sufficiency. Network Capacity Building will expand to the other three counties in 2011 and 2012.

Our Programs

AGENCY RELATIONS This program links 350 partner programs and our warehouse. We also provide resources and training, including our new Agency Development & Training Institute, to share and foster network best practices. Our partner programs include meal sites, shelters, food pantries, elder and youth centers, and other food assistance sites.

BROWN BAG FOOD FOR ELDERLY This “pantry-on-wheels” provides a free monthly bag of groceries to about 6,000 low-income elders at 76 sites in 51 communities. It is the region’s largest direct-to-client feeding program.

DOOR TO DOOR DELIVERY Our regional delivery program enables us to provide more food to more people by delivering products from our warehouse directly to the doors of more than 100 partner programs and Brown Bag sites, as well as regional distribution hubs.

NETWORK CAPACITY BUILDING Launched in 2010, this initiative focuses on building the capacity of the regional emergency food network by connecting agencies to each other, building partnerships, strengthening services, and streamlining distribution to people in need.

NUTRITION We provide nutrition education to food assistance agencies; a nutritional rating system that ranks the healthfulness of products in our warehouse; and “Intergenerational Community Meals” workshops for residents on home cooking, smart shopping, and meal planning tips for long-term healthy eating habits.

SNAP OUTREACH & ENROLLMENT The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP, formerly Food Stamps) is an important resource for families to buy food. The Food Bank conducts SNAP outreach and enrollment at emergency food sites around the region, and provides training for agencies to conduct their own SNAP outreach.

THE FOOD BANK FARM We own a 60-acre farm in Hadley that produces fresh, chemical-free vegetables for people in need, in partnership with Mountain View Farm CSA.

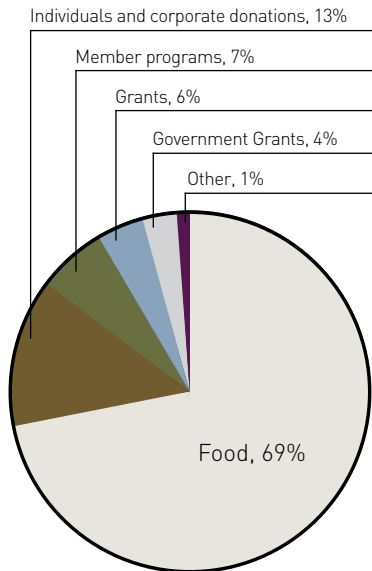

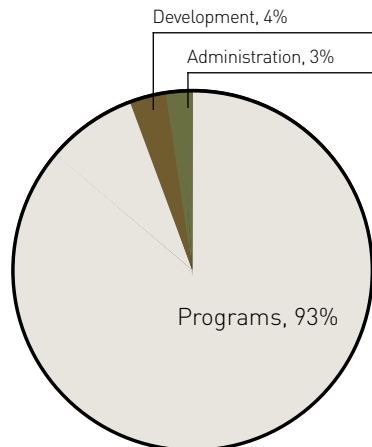
