  - To see some details you need to register for an account

## Federal Grants

- The federal government has a digital grants portal: <a href="www.grants.gov">www.grants.gov</a>
- Things to know
  - You'll need both a UEI (replaced DUNS) a SAM Cage Code to apply for federal grants.
  - The database is organized by <u>CFDA numbers</u>
  - To see some details you'll need to register for an account
